**TOILE** explores the idea of the first gesture.

In fashion, a *toile* is a prototype, a study of form, proportion, and movement.

These works function in a similar way. They are finished objects that still behave like drafts. Open, responsive, and holding onto the energy of their making.

Each light starts as a simple square of cloth, then folded, stitched, and shaped by hand. The process remains visible, holding onto the energy of its making.

Light is not concealed, but softened through the fabric, creating a quiet, diffused presence.

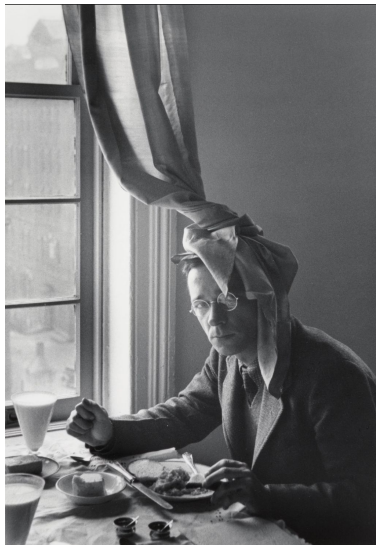
